



Spooner, WI, the largest city in Washburn County, is seeking \$3.5 million in funding from WisDOT for restoration of the unique Chicago and Northwestern Railroad (C&NW) roundhouse and turntable. Plans are to turn this currently unused historic property, which is easily accessible by walking, bicycle, horseback, skiing, ATV, snowmobiling, train, and auto, into a distinct event center and a landmark touring site within the developing Railroad Park. The C&NW is the reason Spooner exists. In the late 1800s, the railroad was searching for a suitable location in the area for a switching yard and maintenance facility. The site chosen and developed by railroad employees was named after John Coit Spooner, the railroad attorney and U.S. senator from WI who was instrumental in early community development.

The City owned the land which included the railroad sand tower and weigh station that surrounded the roundhouse/turntable property. The Railroad Park Board (RPB) was formed by Mayor Gary Cuskey in 2009, and tasked with developing the area into a safe, welcoming park. In 2016, the City acquired the roundhouse and the turntable, took steps to remove/remediate hazardous materials, repair structural timbers, and restore the roof of the roundhouse. The restoration was entrusted to the RPB to plan and the Friends of the Railroad Park (FORRP) to implement. The empty historic building requires 100% remodeling and restoration. The rare, original turntable requires extensive rehabilitation. FORRP contracted DBS Group to develop preliminary design information: Site Plan, Floor Plan, Exterior 3-D Fly-Around, and Interior 3-D Fly-Through. Through private funding, FORRP installed a parking lot base adjacent to the roundhouse, renovated the decaying weigh station, and will complete a picnic pavilion in March of 2020. FORRP will install five signs describing the historic sites crucial to train operation as well as add additional walking trails throughout the Railroad Park. Furthermore, plans for the Park include a railroad-themed playground, band shell, splash pad, benches, and extensive landscaping. The Park currently includes a skating rink, picnic tables, sand volleyball courts, and hosts the annual Jack Pine Savage Dash.

The economic, educational, and connectivity impact this project would have on Spooner, the County, and the area is significant. The centrally located site is one block from the thriving downtown shopping district; one block away from a hotel with 3 others nearby; the Railroad Memories and WI Heritage Canoe Museums are adjacent to the site. There is an active railroad track, the terminus of the WI Great Northern Railroad (WGN) located onsite. The WGN is involved in helping the Park, and will bring a dining car into the roundhouse. The old railroad right of way is now the Wild Rivers Trail, connecting to hundreds of miles of ATV and snowmobile trails. Restoring the historic roundhouse and turntable would establish a safe and exciting start and end point for ATV, snowmobile, skiing, horseback riding, hiking, bicycle, road, and recreational trail trips. To the east of the roundhouse is a new thoroughfare, Roundhouse Road. The alternative to this project is demolition which would delete a vital part of local history. Spooner, a two-hour drive from the Twin City metro area, is a tourist destination throughout the year, attracting ATV's, snowmobilers, skiers, fishermen, hunters, bicyclists, sightseers and more, whom spent a total of \$45.7 million in Washburn County last year. The restoration and opening of this site will create jobs and educational, recreational and community opportunities for all ages and interests through the addition of festivals, farmer's markets, art shows, weddings, concerts and more. This project is listed as a priority by the Washburn County Economic Development Corporation for continued economic growth, quality of life management, and will help continue our unique trend of increasing our population in demographics vital to our continued growth in a rural Wisconsin area.

Cost Guidance Summary

Dear Terri,

This letter is regarding the potential, forthcoming conversion of the existing Railroad Roundhouse in Spooner, WI into a Community Event Center. Per your request, DBS Group has developed a Cost Guidance Summary for design, construction improvements and equipment allowances associated with this project, with costs based upon our verbal discussions as well as pricing for past, similar projects.

#### **General Assumptions:**

No structural modifications shall be incorporated, including mezzanines and/or roof-mounted equipment.

Brick shall be tuckpointed and/or repaired at the interior and exterior.

New exterior doors & windows shall be incorporated.

Existing concrete floor shall remain exposed and shall be refinished to the extent possible.

Existing wood timbers & roof structure shall remain exposed and shall be cleaned to the extent possible.

Mid-level quality-level for finishes shall be incorporated throughout, with material specifications being of materials normally utilized in a community center/event center/banquet facility. Demising walls and space allocation shall be provided for (1) serving Kitchen for the main event center area.

Plumbing, HVAC and Electric systems shall be new to accommodate the proposed building improvements.

Electric, natural gas and water utilities – services are available at the site to accommodate the proposed improvements.

Less than 1-acre of site improvements shall be incorporated, thus eliminating the need for stormwater treatment.

#### **Specific Inclusions:**

Design & Engineering services.

Design-Assist Preconstruction services.

General Conditions, Insurance, Builders Risk Insurance, Project Management, and Supervision.

City of Spooner Building Permit fee allowance.

Limited site improvements including:

- o 6' high vinyl-coated chain link fencing around existing turntable.
- o 6' wide sidewalk running parallel to building along South edge of building.
- o New water service (fire and domestic) and sanitary sewer service extended into building.
- o \$4,000 allowance for misc. seeding or landscaping at building entrances.
- o Dumpster and recycling bin enclosures.
- o Four (4) parking lot or pavilion site lighting pole.

Construction improvements to convert the facility into a Community Center & Event Center including, but not limited to:

- o Tuckpointing exterior masonry.
- o Tuckpointing interior masonry at exposed areas only.
- o Clean and sealing of existing structural timbers that will be left exposed.
- One (1) serving kitchen for the main event center area including:

Hand wash sink, large compartment sink with garbage disposal, and tables only.

o Bar and associated back-bar including:

Solid surface bartop.

- (2) Hand wash sinks and (1) large compartment sink with garbage disposal.
- o New interior construction improvements, including interior demising walls, doors, windows, finishes (floor, walls & ceilings) and accessories.
- Complete fire sprinkler, mechanical, plumbing, and electrical systems.

Acoustical panel allowance.

Window treatment allowance.

\$25,000 allowance for building & site signage.

FF&E allowance for tables, chairs, accessories, etc. for common area seating, dining, meeting rooms and offices.

Low voltage systems allowance, including Phone/Data, Wi-Fi and Security.

\$25,000 allowance for Owner marketing and project development.

Assumption that the project would be designed, priced and permitted such that construction can begin on approximately April 1, 2021.

#### **Specific Exclusions:**

Geotechnical study, unsuitable soil remediation and/or special foundation systems.

Phase I environmental study, hazardous material testing and/or hazardous material abatement.

Structural modifications, including mezzanines and/or roof-mounted equipment.

Repair and/or replacement of the membrane roof system.

Emergency generator, with associated transfer switches, wiring, and equipment pad.

City impact fees and/or special assessments.

Public utility service extension fees.

Winter construction costs.

Permanent interior stage structure.



## BREAKING NEW GROUND IN CONSTRUCTION.

Provisions for dining rail car including rails or mechanical, electrical, and plumbing connections. Commercial Prep and/or Serving kitchens and associated equipment & fixtures.

Internal buildout and equipment & fixtures for Gift Shop and associated kitchen area.

Two (2) operable partitions to demise the gathering space.

Site improvements including, but not limited to:

- o A parking lot aggregate base, asphalt paving, ADA signage or sidewalks North of the Roundhouse.
- o Picnic pavilion, exterior bandshell structure, playground equipment and exterior restrooms.
- o Picnic tables, benches, bike racks, or trash receptacles.
- Exterior stamped-concrete and/or gravel for seating/patio area between the Roundhouse and the Turntable.
- o Landscaping, as well as limestone path from turntable to Wild Rivers Trail.
- o Repairs to, and restoration of, the rail car turntable.
- O Storm sewer provisions, fire hydrants and/or provisions for a fire access road.
- o Street improvements.
