To: The Honorable Chair and Members of the Oconto County Board of Supervisors

Re: Chapter 19 - Offenses Against Public Safety, Welfare and Protection

WHEREAS, the Health and Human Services Board has reviewed Chapter 19 – Offenses Against Public Safety, Welfare and Protection and recommends the following amendments:

NOW THEREFORE, the Oconto County Board of Supervisors does ordain as follows:

SECTION 1: Chapter 19, of the Offenses Against Public Safety, Welfare and Protection is amended to read as follows:

19.050 STATE LAWS ADOPTED

(a) Adoption. The following State Statutes are hereby adopted and incorporated as if fully set forth by reference. The penalty for a violation of these ordinances shall be set forth in Sec. 19.050(d), and (e) of this ordinance. Any future amendments, revisions, or modifications of the Statutes incorporated herein by reference are intended to be made part of this code.

19.1500 COMMUNICABLE DISEASE - ENFORCEMENT AND PENALTIES

- (a) Definitions. Those definitions as set forth in Wis. Stats. Ch. 252, specifically as set forth in Wis. Stats. §252.01 and are hereby adopted and by reference made a part of this section as if fully set forth in this section.
- (b) Statutes. Wisconsin Statute §252.03, §252.06, §252.25, and the provisions of Wis. Admin. Code Chapter DHS 145 as amended and/or renumbered from time to time, are incorporated by reference and shall apply as set forth or as amended.
- (c) Prohibitions. No person or entity shall willfully violate or obstruct the execution of any state statute or rule, Wisconsin Department of Health Services or Oconto County Health Officer's order or rule, county, city of village ordinance enacted under State of Wisconsin Chapter 252 and relating to the public health. Violations may include, but are not limited to the following:
 - (1) Refusal to obey quarantine or isolation rules or orders.
 - (2) Refusal to obey orders or rules restricting public gatherings.
 - (3) Refusal to cooperate with contact tracing conducted by the Oconto County Health Officer (or designees).
 - (4) Refusal to obey the Oconto County Health Officer's business or facility closure order, when such facility or business has been identified as a setting that fosters disease transmission.
 - (5) Refusal to cooperate with the investigation under this ordinance of any place or its occupants by the Oconto County Health Officer (or designee).
- (d) Authority. Those Oconto County Health Officer, or designee, is conferred citation authority in accordance with Wis. Stat. §66.0113.

- (e) Violations. Whenever a violation of this section is found, the Sheriff's deputy, city or village law enforcement officer, or the Oconto County Health Officer or designee may issue a forfeiture citation. The Sheriff or sheriff's deputy may investigate a criminal violation pursuant to Wisconsin Statues Chapter 252 for a criminal violation. Citations issued shall conform to Oconto County Code of Ordinances and Wis. Stats. §66.0113(1)(b) and as amended from time to time.
- (f) Penalties. Any person who violates this section is subject to a minimum forfeiture of \$100.00 but the forfeiture shall not exceed \$500.00 for each violation.
- (g) Application. The foregoing shall be effective in a state of emergency, as set forth in Sections 1 and 2, below:
 - 1. Declared State of Emergency [Ch. 323, Wis. Stats.]

- A. Declaration by County Board of Supervisors
 - 1. Sec. 323.11, Wis. Stats. (as it currently exists or is hereafter revised) is incorporated herein by reference as if fully set forth.
 - a. The Oconto County Board of Supervisors ("County Board") may declare, by ordinance or resolution, an emergency (including a public health emergency per Sec. 323.02(16), Wis. Stats.) existing within Oconto County whenever conditions arise by reason of a communicable disease, a riot or civil commotion, a disaster, or an imminent threat of a disaster, that impairs transportation, food or fuel supplies, medical care, fire, health or police protection, or other critical systems of the local unit of government.
 - b. The period of the emergency shall be limited by the ordinance or resolution to the time during which the emergency conditions exist or are likely to exist.
 - 2. If, because of the emergency conditions, the County Board is unable to meet promptly, the County Board Chair will exercise by proclamation all of the powers conferred upon the County Board under Sec. A above that appear necessary and expedient.
 - a. The proclamation shall be subject to ratification, alteration, modification, or repeal by the County Board as soon as that body can meet.
 - b. The subsequent action taken by the County Board shall not affect the prior validity of the proclamation.
- B. Sec. 323.14(4), Wis. Stats. (as it currently exists or is hereafter revised) is incorporated herein by reference as if fully set forth.
 - 1. The emergency power of the County Board conferred under Sec. 1.A.1. above includes the general authority to order, by ordinance or resolution, whatever is necessary and expedient for the health, safety, protection, and welfare of persons and property within the local unit of government in the emergency.
 - 2. This includes the power to bar, restrict, or remove all unnecessary traffic, both vehicular and pedestrian, from the highways, notwithstanding any provision of Ch.'s 341 and 349, Wis. Stats.
- (h) Severability. Should any portion of this ordinance be declared unconstitutional or invalid by a court of competent jurisdiction, the remainder of this ordinance shall not be affected.
- (i) Purpose. The purpose of this ordinance is to promote the public health, safety and welfare of the citizens of Oconto County.
- SECTION 2: This ordinance shall take affect after passage and publication as provided by law.
